THE COOK ISLANDS

- Polynesian Island Group
- Has 15 Islands
- Over 2.2 million sq km of Pacific Ocean
- Land area of 240sq km
- Northern Group 6 Islands
- Southern Group 9 Islands



THE COOK ISLANDS

- 50 Years of Self
 Governing (4 August
 1965).
- Main Island Rarotonga 32km circumference
- Population of 12,000 (2010 census)
- 10,000 on Rarotonga
- Main Income Tourism





RAROTONGA – THE MAIN HUB

- Government offices & Parliament
- Main town area 30 minutes from Southernmost village – Titikaveka
- Domination of supplies and services
- Monopoly telecommunications provider

- 6,200 telephone land lines, available to over 98% of population;
- 17,200 mobile connections, GSM technology. 3G operational in Rarotonga.
- Mobile coverage to over 98% of population;
- Mobile roaming (voice, text and data) with more than 200 international partners;
- 2,500+ broadband connections ADSL2 service available to over 98% of population;
- 300+ Telecom WiFi hotspots around the 12 Islands;
- Underground fibre cable loop around Rarotonga;



- 2 satellite links on IS18 (Inteslat GEO Satellite);
- All 11 populated Outer Islands have fixed lines, broadband & mobile services.
- 120 employees, including 19 on Outer Islands (96% Cook Islanders);
- Universal Service Obligation delivered by virtue of a Shareholders' agreement between Government and Telecom NZ;
- About one quarter of revenue from non-residents;
- Responsible for Postal Service and Maritime Radio;
- History of continuous price reduction.

The Shareholders Joint Venture Agreement (1997):

- Grants Telecom Cook Islands the sole right to operate telecommunications in the cook Islands;
- In return the Company must provide universal service to the Outer Islands, operate Postal & Maritime Radio service;
- The Company is also required to spend a specified minimum amount of capital in the Outer Islands over the term of the JVA and any renewals;
- The loss on providing Outer Islands services has exceeded \$500k p/a for many years;
- The JVA has resulted in the Cooks now being at or near the top in the Pacific for uptake of fixed, mobile and broadband services.

SALE OF TELECOM NZ SHARES:

• Telecom NZ offered their shares for sale in November 2013.

•Digicel was aligned to purchase these shares however local regulations meant Telecom NZ had to first advertise in Country for an allotted time.

•Several consortiums were being built in a bid to have the majority stakeholder position.

•The winning consortium was eventually Bluesky Pacific who offered a shareholder chance for the staff and people of the Cook Islands

• Bluesky Pacific began full operation in late February 2015.
